






But Sam's not ready to go to bed, and neither are his monkeys. They jump and bump and hop-hop-hop until they all pile up in a heap-heap-heap.

THE STORY OF FERDINAND has inspired, enchanted, and provoked readers ever since it was first published in 1936 for its message of nonviolence and pacifism. During World War II, Adolf Hitler ordered the book burned in Nazi Germany, while Joseph Stalin granted it privileged status as the only non-communist children's book allowed in Poland.

The preeminent leader of Indian nationalism and civil rights, Mahatma Gandhi, even called it his favorite book.

The story was adapted by Walt Disney into a short animated film entitled *Ferdinand the Bull* in 1938. *Ferdinand the Bull* won the 1938 Academy Award for Best Short Subject (Cartoons). A new animated film adaptation from Blue Sky Studios (creators of *Ice Age*, *Rio*, and the *Peanuts* movie) and directed by Carlos Saldanha will be released in December 2017.
